What are its main aims and objectives? What, if anything, will change as a result of this proposal?

The Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 requires local authorities to undertake a compulsory Statutory Polling District and Polling Place Review within the period 1 October 2023 and 31 January 2025 inclusive and every 5 years thereafter. Midlothian's Review has now been carried out and the proposals are contained within the report.

As part of the review process local authorities must:-

- Seek to ensure that all electors in the constituency have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances;
- Seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable, the polling places are accessible to those who are disabled; and
- When considering or reviewing the designation of a polling place, have regard to the accessibility needs of disabled persons.
